ROMAN SOLDIER'S TENT



NAME:	Sub pellibus
DESCRIPTION:	This is the leather from the side of a Roman Soldiers' tent. It was used by every group of eight soldiers called a "Contubernium" and would be put up every time they stopped for the night. This was found at a fort called Vindolanda near Hadrian's Wall.
