**Roman legionary word list**

These are some of the words that a Roman Legionary or an auxiliary soldier would have used

<b>Braccae</b>	Long trousers
<b>Lorica Segmentata</b>	Body armour
<b>Caligae</b>	Sandals
<b>Balteus</b>	Belt
<b>Baldric</b>	Sling for dagger that goes over the shoulder
<b>Scutum</b>	Shield
<b>Galea or Cassis</b>	Helmet
<b>Impedimenta</b>	The name for all your equipment put together
<b>Furca</b>	The t shaped pole you carry your kit on
<b>Focale</b>	Scarf
<b>Fibula</b>	Scarf pin
<b>Gladius</b>	Sword
<b>Contubernium</b>	A group of eight soldiers who lived together in a leather tent when they made camp
<b>Centuria ('Century' in English)</b>	A group of 80 men
<b>Centurion</b>	The man in charge of a century
<b>Cohors ('Cohort' in English)</b>	A group of 6 centuries (480 men)
<b>Legio ('Legion' in English)</b>	10 cohorts (4,800 men, but could be as many as 5,000 with all the commanders and support troops)
<b>Legato</b>	The man in charge of a legion
<b>Tribune</b>	The second person in charge of a legion
<b>Prefect</b>	The third person in charge of a legion
<b>Auxilia</b>	Soldiers who weren't Roman but from conquered lands such as Gaul (modern-day France)
